As limited enrollment programs, the Nursing programs have a selective, competitive admission process and includes additional requirements beyond admission to Brunswick Community College. Please make sure you have completed all requirements below prior to submitting your nursing program application.

5	Attend a mandatory Nursing information session via Moodle.
	Submit ALL official educational transcripts and AP or CLEP scores to Student Services. Verify transcript evaluation has occurred through your personal Self Service account. If your anticipated course is not listed, please follow up with Student Services.
~	GPA requirement: GPA 2.5 or higher at current institution to submit application
	Meet English proficiency with one of the following: Complete DRE courses through DRE 098 (prior to 2019) Have an unweighted high school GPA of 2.8 or higher within last 10 years Complete ENG 111 or equivalent with a "C" or higher if co-requisite course is required Meet appropriate scores on placement test if high school GPA over 10 years ago Transfer credit for ENG 111 or higher
	Meet Math proficiency with <u>one</u> of the following: Complete DMA 010-080 (prior to 2019) Have an unweighted high school GPA of 2.8 or higher within last 10 years Complete MAT 143, MAT 152, or MAT 171 or equivalent with a "C" or higher if co-requisite is required Meet appropriate scores on placement test if high school GPA over 10 years Transfer credit for approved college level MAT
	NC Nurse Aide: Complete a NC state approved Nurse Aide program and be listed on the N.C. Nurse Aide Registry as a Nurse Aide I without substantiated findings by application deadline. Please note that your CNA certification must stay active throughout your time in the BCC Nursing Program. *Not required if applicant possesses a current, unencumbered LPN license.
	Schedule and take TEAS test by application deadline: Register to take the TEAS test at atitesting.com. TEAS tests may be taken once every three months. Scores are good for three years Submit official scores through atitesting.com if TEAS taken at another institution Applicants must score a minimum of 59 on the TEAS to apply
	Complete English Language proficiency requirement if: □ English is not your native language. □ If you did not graduate from a high school or college in the US.
	Complete the Nursing application and submit all supporting documents by 3 pm on January 31, 2022. IMPORTANT: Any application received after the deadline will not be considered and eligibility to be considered will be forfeited.

Competitive Admissions Process*

Applicants will be assigned points for non-NUR courses that are a part of the Associate Degree Nursing curriculum that have been completed by the application deadline (end of fall semester).

- To receive points for BIO 168, BIO 169, BIO 275, the class must have been completed within 5 years of the first NUR class.
- A grade of "C" or better is required in all program related courses.
- Points received are based on the first attempt of the course.

Additional points will be awarded based on TEAS composite scores:

65-69 percentile = 5 points 70-79 percentile = 10 points 80-89 percentile = 15 points 90+ percentile = 20 points

Graduation from a regionally accredited college or university:

Associate's degree = 5 points Bachelor's degree = 6 points Master's degree = 8 points

Full acceptance is contingent upon maintaining eligibility requirements (GPA, grades, CNA, etc.)



Criminal background check, drug screen, and immunization documentation required. Student may be dismissed from the program prior to, or during the program if student does not meet the clinical agency requirements. Any student who tests positive for an illegal or illegally obtained controlled substance will be <u>dismissed</u> from the Nursing Program and will be <u>prohibited</u> from reapplying to a Brunswick Community College Nursing Program in the future.
